In a single year, more than:

- 75,000 people are helped by our programs and services.
- Food for 900,000 meals is distributed.
- 16,000 nights of shelter are provided.



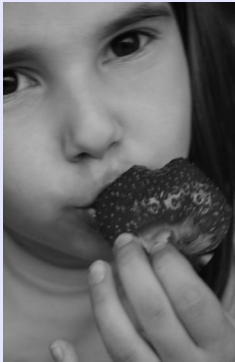

## Hope in the Inland Valley



### Food Security Program

People living in poverty often sacrifice their food budgets to make ends meet. As a result, low-income families eat a smaller variety of foods that are inexpensive and less healthy. In response to local needs, Inland Valley Hope Partners operates four Food Pantries that serve 13 communities. The Pantries provide low-income families and individuals with enough food to make several nutritious meals. Each location doubles as a neighborhood education center to provide the support, encouragement and resources people in crisis need to change their circumstances.

### Emergency Housing

As the costs of transportation and housing rise, so does the need for emergency housing. *Our House* provides up to 90 days of safe, temporary shelter for homeless families and women. The program includes support services to help families become successful at independent living such as job readiness training, life skills development, financial education, parenting classes, family and individual counseling, and support groups. These services are provided by qualified Hope Partners staff and collaborative service providers and businesses. During their stay at *Our House*, families save 95 percent of their disposable income that can be used for move-in to permanent housing after they leave the program.

### Farmers' Market

Eating fresh fruits and vegetables is essential to healthy living. Inland Valley Hope Partners sponsors the Pomona Valley Certified Farmers' Market each Saturday to provide a forum for the community to purchase fresh produce from family farmers. The market also operates in conjunction with Food Stamp and WIC (Women, Infants and Children) programs, and is located on Pearl at Garey Ave. in Pomona.

### Additional Supportive Services

As funding is made available, Inland Valley Hope Partners provides other services to people on the verge of homelessness. When shelters are full, motel vouchers bring relief to homeless families. Typically, families are granted motel stays for three to five days. During this time, Hope Partners serves as an advocate for the family, finding additional help from other Hope Partners programs and outside resources.

Inland Valley Hope Partners provides utility and rent/mortgage assistance in an effort to prevent homelessness of low-income people who have received eviction or utility shut-off notices. Especially during the peak winter months, many people living in poverty do not have the money to cover the added cost of heating their homes.



## How you can bring hope

Individuals, businesses, faith communities, and other community groups all have the power to bring hope to their community. Here is how you can be a partner in hope:

- Make a financial contribution. Funds are always needed to buy food, operate the emergency shelter, and provide support services.
- Volunteer your time. You can serve in a variety of roles at the food pantries, special events, housing and administrative offices.
- Hold a food drive at your worksite for non-perishable food items.
- Sponsor or participate in annual fundraising events such as the Golf Classic, Walk for the Hungry, Quakes and Reign games.
- Participate in the holiday opportunities: Adopt-A-Family, toy drive, Thanksgiving Program, and "Alternative Giving" program. Contributions can be made in honor of your loved ones.
- Donate supplies to help us lower the cost of providing services. Hope Partners is always in need of personal toiletries, paper products, cleaning supplies, and books, arts and crafts for children.
